- A. Budget 2016 – Appropriation Levy Resolution
A memo was presented to the Commission for proposed Resolution 15-149. Should Resolution 15-149 pass, the levy would be set at \$4,714,000 and the appropriations would be set at \$211,483,977. The levy proposed does not

require the individualized letters. The appropriations do have a number of contingencies that are subject to revenues materializing. Commissioner Bekkedahl thanked the department heads and commissioners for participating in the budget meetings. Commissioner Bekkedahl stated the budget is stabilizing and getting ahead of the operating expenses. The equipment needs are being wrapped up. Included are municipal highway expenditures of approximately \$65 million. This may not materialize if the funding is not available. The property tax levy increased about \$500,000 this year. Most or all of that is new growth in the City, so no increases in existing tax base. It costs about \$19.31 per day per person to run the City of that cost roughly \$0.43 per person per day is the local property tax levy; about 2.2% of the total expenditures. Commissioner Bekkedahl is hopeful the budget performs as expected and the tax payers see a good benefit. Mayor Klug state Williston's tax is very low in comparison to surrounding areas.

Donald Kress, Planning and Zoning presented the following:

- B. Public hearing for the vacation and discontinuance of a public ROW in Block 26, Bruegger's 2nd Addition to the City of Williston (alley north of Williams County Courthouse) – Williams County/AE2S
This is a request for vacation of alley for the courthouse. There is an alley on the north side of it that runs from 3rd St to the west. This is a 20 foot wide alley. The vacated portion is approximately 300 feet long. The alley was dedicated by the plat for Bruegger's 2nd addition. Vacation of this alley does not affect street access or water and sewer connection to any lots adjacent to the alley to be vacated. Resolution 15-146, vacating this ROW, is presented for the Commissioner's consideration. This will provide additional space for the proposed expansion of the Williams County LEC. The notes of the Ad Hoc committee along with the Planning Commission are presented in the commission packet. Concerns were raised regarding adequate parking. Although this is only a vacation before the commission tonight it is part of a larger plan to improve the County Campus downtown. There will be some expansion, building and for parking. The applicant's architect presented at the Planning Commission and did a thorough presentation on the overall plan. His calculations determined the entire County Campus will provide 289 spaces and total required by the downtown parking plan is 288 spaces. Bill Moonen, representing AE2S stated they have been working with the utilities that are present in the alley and working on relocation agreements. Some of the "transmission lines" serve properties other than just the courthouse. Commissioner Bekkedahl clarified that the access off of Broadway and the existing public parking does remain open. Commissioner Bekkedahl also discussed the streetscapes in relation to East

Bob Hanson, City Engineer presented the following:

- A. Tyler & Randy Jung – Missing Stub Out Sewer-4305 1st Ave E
A water and sewer system was installed along 1st Ave E under Water & Sewer District 13-6 with the intention of installing a 1" water service line and a 4" sewer service line into each lot including Lot 7, Block 5 of the Sande Subdivision with the address of 4305 1st Ave E which is owned by the Jung's. The Jung's purchased the property with the intention of building a house on the property. As part of the house project they had obtained an excavation permit for running the water and sewer service lines from the existing stub outs to the location of the proposed house. Using ND One Call the Jung's requested the City Engineer's office to mark the locations of the water and sewer stub outs. The water curb stop was located and the location of the sewer stub out was marked as being 10 feet south of the water service line as well as all other sewer service lines along 1st Ave E had been installed 10 feet south of the water service lines. The Jung's were able to successfully install the water service line. The Jung's, using a rented backhoe were unable to locate the sewer service stub out at the location marked by the City Engineer's office. Upon investigation with the project plans, record drawings and consulting engineer, it was determined that a sewer service stub out had not been installed into the Jung's property. The Jung's were asked to install the missing sewer service because they had the backhoe on site at the time. The Jung's chose not to install the missing sewer service line stating they did not want to be responsible for the compaction and gravel in the street and for crossing any conflicting utility lines. The Jung's have submitted a bill for the rental of the backhoe in the amount of \$2,242.66. The property has been assessed for the water and sewer systems installed and the cost does include the cost of a sewer service stub. Due to this, the City does owe the Jung's a sewer service stub. Mr. Hanson recommends the City pay \$1,403.14 of the Jung's \$2,442.66 backhoe rental bill (the bill contains an \$839.52 charge for repair of damage to the backhoe) and also recommend the City undertake the installation of a 4" sewer service line from the 1st Ave E sewer main to the Jung property line.

Form of governance options have been studied by the committee in regards to a draft organizational chart along with job descriptions for two administrative positions. The next step is to review the rate adjustment scenario out of the sanitary sewer rate study.

Brad Bekkedahl, City Commissioner presented the following:

- (3) Well Pad Policy
Previously in the year, there were discussions had regarding road damage issues with the corridor roads being built within the City where well pads are or could be located. At that time the Commission decided against a blanket policy. Typically the areas are special assessed which comes back on the owners of the property; state law prohibits the City from assessing the oil companies, because the GPT is the assessment in lieu of property tax and the Commission did not feel this is fair to the property owners. It was discussed that the City set up a permit fee application process as part of the SPU that the Planning Commission can review and in that language the oil company would pay either a \$10,000 per well contribution to the road damage or a \$50,000 per spacing unit permit fee regardless of number of wells placed in that unit. This is only within the City limits, not the ETJ and only involving permanent road structures. A fee structure needs to be developed and give the attorney time to research this.

Bob Hanson, City Engineer presented the following:

- (1) Water & Sewer District 15-7 – Selland Construction – Change Order #1
The contractor, Selland Construction, has encountered soft, wet soil along 49th St that is unsuitable for the construction of a paved surface. These soils were removed and replaced at a cost of \$16,851. This change order also included Tracer Wire and restrained water fittings added at the request of the Water Department. The total of the change order is \$34,177.03. This is an assessment project and the estimated assessments have been published in the newspaper.

This change order is about 8% of the original contract, it is within the assessments.

Anderson & Wood has removed and replaced approximately 3,000 cubic yards of the unsuitable materials at a cost of \$157,861.80; the amount of 7.5% of the original construction cost.

- (3) Water, Sewer & Street District 15-17 – Selland Construction – Change Order #1
The grading of 11th St through the Bell Coulee requires a back slope that would conflict with a 12" intermediate pressure MDU gas main. MDU estimates it would cost approximately \$250,000 to relocate the gas main. As an alternative, Selland Construction offers to construct retaining walls at a cost of \$104,310 to resolve this conflict by limiting the extent of the back slopes of 11th St. Normally the City's franchise agreement with MDU would require MDU relocate the gas main at their expense. In this case, MDU's gas main lies in an easement outside of 11th St ROW and along an alignment that was approved two years ago by the City Engineer's office who at the time pictured 11th St being built at a much higher grade whose back slopes would not have conflicted with the gas main. The final designs called for a lower grade which reduced the length of the Bell Drainage Box Culvert and reduced the amounts of imported fill required to construct the 11th St embankment. It is estimated that the shortened box culvert and reduced embankment quantities reduced the project by \$300,000-400,000.
