3. Public Hearings

Rachael Ressler with Planning Department presented the following:

- A. Ordinance 1031 – Fabric Structures amends section 25 of ordinance 613, zoning ordinance. Ms. Ressler stated that this adds section P, fabric structures. This proposed update would allow the use of fabric structure in M1 and M2 zoning districts if the property along the highway 2 & 85 corridor or the 1804 corridor, the ordinance would require that the structure be located at least 300 feet from the right of way. Also the structure may be used only for inert, permanent industrial storage and must be all building and fire codes for permanent buildings. This does not preclude fabric from being used as an accent material or tents being used for temporary structure. Presently there is a moratorium on fabric structures – this was put in place at the City Commissioners meeting August 11, 2015. Planning met with Mahaffey, 3 local architects and a local representative from Red River Supply. Ms. Ressler stated that the Planning & Zoning Commission said that a definition of fabric structures would be detrimental to the ordinance because of the quickly changing technology in fabric.

Jordan Evert, City Attorney, presented the following:

- B. Ordinance 1032 – Mr. Evert stated that this amends zoning of adult establishments and repeals Ordinance 936. The last time the City has addressed ordinances regarding adult oriented businesses was in 2011. The current status is the location of these types of business to be located in M2 zoning district. The only two such businesses in Williston are currently located in a commercial zone. Previous regulations required them to be in an M2 zoning district, but did not impose a time limit. This amendment will impose a time limit and is otherwise not much change. Other communities were reviewed with regards to this subject. Mr. Evert's research includes police reports from 2008 to 2015 regarding Whispers and Heartbreakers, and some data on the Jonathan Horvath murder trial. Also included was case law with regard to adult oriented business both state and national. The negative secondary effects include over 200 incidences where the police department responded between 2013 and 2015. This ordinance applies to adult establishments which are within the City limits, and is an amendment to 613, section 25. It adds a subsection N, adult establishments. It also repeals ordinance 936. 1032 did not exist in the previous regulations – it requires that a non-conforming use relocate to M2 within one year, with the extension based upon a demonstration of economic hardship. A violation is a class D misdemeanor.

Detective Peterson presented the following as part of Jordan Evert's presentation:

Detective Peterson stated that he has been lead investigator on some of the incidences with the two establishments, Whispers and Heartbreakers. For example, Jackson was carrying a pistol inside Heartbreakers, he was a bouncer. The PD believes that the only reason there was not a shooting is because that gun misfired. In 2013 there was the death of Derrick Spiegel. On surveillance security personnel from Whispers were seen removing fire arms from their waistbands and shotguns from their trench coats. In 2014 there was the death of Dean Niederklopper in front of Whispers. A bouncer punched Niederklopper, causing him to fall. Either the fall or the punch caused his death. In September 2014 a Mr. Clement was assaulted outside of Heartbreakers, which caused him to fall. He sustained a brain injury. In July 2015 a dancer at Heartbreakers was intoxicated. When two officers responded, they were assaulted. There is little cooperation from the clubs. It is estimated that over 50% of PD resources are spent on these two establishments. Officers are on foot patrol, especially on weekends, strictly for these two establishments. This takes resources away from a very busy detective division.

Jordan Evert then spoke:

Ordinance 1032 has three portions which pertain to the adult oriented business. The first is a zoning ordinance, the second is a licensing ordinance process, the third is an ordinance pertaining to liquor license, which prohibits allowing adult cabaret to maintain a liquor license on their premises.

KLUG OPENED THE PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCE 1032.

Greg Hennessy, representing Heartbreakers, presented the following:

Mr. Hennessy inquired with Jordan Evert whether he used the Mc Crothers case to draft this ordinance as the language is recognizable. Mr. Hennessy described the case. Mc Crothers d/b/a Tree City Bar in Mandan was in close proximity to a second bar on Main Street and had been there for 22 years when the case came up. A third bar attempted to open on Main Street at which point that it was discovered that the liquor license can be separated from the adult entertainment establishment, based on a supreme court case called Renton. The licensure of liquor is nowhere found in the First Amendment. The First Amendment guarantees the right to adult entertainment some place in the City. Apparently this place will be an industrial zoned area instead of the commercial zoned area. Three of the municipalities studied allow the liquor license to stay with the club even though they were relocated. Mr. Hennessy's client recognizes the City as the licensing authority under the Mc Crothers case. Regarding taxable valuations within 1250 feet of an establishment - Mr. Hennessy's client questions whether what with all of the downtown improvements, a diminishment of taxable valuation has taken place. Lastly, regarding truck bypass. There is language in this proposed ordinance that mentions this one year extension. There seemed to be an omission regarding this time limit- Minot allowed a 3 year extension in order to make the transition. Considering that Williston is in the heart of the Bakken, and the economy is down, the one year time frame is not sufficient to allow a transition in an orderly economic way. His client proposes a two year transition and however long it takes thereafter according to the financial records to get the adult entertainment to a location in the industrial zone. As to the land in the M2 zone, given the state of real estate transactions right now, and in this economic circumstance, this is not likely to be a one year process. Also, Minot, Wahpeton and Fargo have all allowed the liquor license to move with the adult establishment. In addition to an extension to a two year time limit, my client asks for a licensure at the new location, for financial reasons. The first amendment right says that adult entertainment cannot be prohibited, only moved. My client proposes to maintain the bar business at the present location. My client suggests that this be put into committee. While the City has the licensure authority, the City also has a constitutional obligation.

Dennis Jensen, program director for Youth for Christ had this to say:

Mr. Jensen thanked the City for the old pistol range building for five years in exchange for repairs they made. He also commended the City Commissioners for caring about our youth. He stated the board of directors of Youth for Christ also commends the Commission, per Mr. Jensen.

Colt Trefferie, citizen, had this to say:

If the City Commission takes the jobs away from the employees of the clubs, they'll be forced to find other jobs. The employees have children to take care of too. Regarding the 200 police calls – have the other bars been compared on their number of police calls? And where is the industrial area that the Commission has referred to?

Mayor Klug answered:

The dark blue on the map on the wall outlines the M2 zoned areas.

(Unintelligible), former (unintelligible) for Whispers, had this to say:

This gentleman says he has cooperated with the police department although not by sending an email of all customers. They pat down and check IDs every person, every time they re-enter, even if several times per day. Regarding the 200 police calls – over what period of time did these occur and how many persons went through their club in that time period? Since February, how many calls has PD received? Whispers calls the police in order to prevent violence. There has been no violence since he became manager. They have a four drink maximum as they do not want to over-serve their customers. Regarding the two youth which illegally entered their facility, they have better security now. Regarding the cars that had to be towed – isn't it better that their customers left their vehicles there rather than drink and drive? In 2011 Mr. Klug said that a group of five should not dictate.

Eddie Parker, citizen, had this to say:

What the mayor said in 2011 still stands - it was your opinion then. How can Dennis Jensen influence this decision? The employees have children too. After you move the establishments across the river, there will be more DUIs and your officers will have to travel farther to respond to calls. I question the 200 police calls. What is the reason that you want these establishments to move? What has changed? Whispers has been here for 17 years. Why was it okay then and not okay now? Kids try to sneak into the bars because there's nothing for them to do here. The convenience stores occasionally sell alcohol to minors by mistake.

Leroy Seidel, citizen, had this to say:

How many female assault cases have you had since 1982? We have 74 churches within a 50 mile radius of Williston. How can two clubs have such an affect with 74 churches around? Also, people go to restaurants for dinner and for drinks and then, later, they go to these clubs. The patrons of the clubs are already intoxicated when they arrive. I question the 200 police calls. In Miles City, MT, with four whore houses nearby, we had the lowest rape and assault rates in the state of MT, per capita.

Sam Stickly, citizen, had this to say:

He's from Las Vegas. He used to drive truck. He was hired at Heartbreakers. Their security personnel are not intimidating. They have few issues. The City should look at the 200 incidences – there are less now than last year. Each year the calls are dwindling. They have the card readers now. He's the DJ there. They treat people well so that there will not be incidences up front. You gotta give the guys a place to go. Our building is not shabby looking, it's newly painted. He's been pulled over in the wee hours seven times by officers who want to find if he's been drinking because he drives a flashy car. The police officers are always polite. I think there's been change in a positive direction.

Austin Diaz, citizen, had this to say:

He's lived here 2 and a half years. He's worked at both Whispers and Heartbreakers. He was the assistant manager of Heartbreakers for a little while. These bars have improved in their safety procedures, how they handle customers, how they handle the intoxicated, etc. It appears to that the City Commission has their minds made up. He has cooperated with law enforcement when they come out to the bars. They were able to resolve things in a peaceful manner. Why can't we all come to a reasonable solution without shutting down the bars and moving them? The M2 zone is 5 miles farther away. Taxi fares will be increased and so people will drive instead. DUIs will increase as will fatalities. The clubs look okay where they are at. Please reconsider.

Jacqueline Harris, citizen, had this to say:

She's worked at Whispers for two years. There are bouncers, dancers, bar tenders, managers, black jack dealers. Please take into consideration that they are people too, and that they have families, too.

Hunter Stuebia, citizen, had this to say:

Regarding minors getting into the bar – how many other bars have had this happen? Whispers and Heartbreakers IDs everyone that comes in.

Guy Ramsey, citizen, had this to say:

Why all this information was not given out prior to this meeting so that the clubs could deal with it?

Mr. Klug answered:

It's almost all public information.

Ken Reiner, citizen, had this to say:

He has a business, a crew, he's divorced, and they like a place to go to. The girls at the clubs are easy to talk to. He's a Christian. Church is not the only place that God is at. We can all work together on this subject. As a business man he understands the financial issues associated with relocating. The property owners in the M2 know that the club owners have to move to M2. Many patrons are responsible. He takes a taxi to and from the clubs.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS – 1ST, 2ND, 3RD TIME**Bruce Sessman, citizen, had this to say:**

On behalf of the establishments, they have done their best to hire the security necessary for the environment. A certain individual stepped into the line of fire to save a girl's life. He ended up with PTSD. He moved to Thailand. He was asked to

return to testify in a trial, which he did. The murderer was convicted at trial. These are the kind of security people that they hire – those which care.

Brostuen, Commissioner, had this to say:

Mayor Klug you were chastised for your 2011 opinion. There has been a lot of water under the bridge since 2011. We as a City have an obligation to protect our citizens. We have a documented record of violence spilling out into the streets in that area. It's public record. Within that area we have an Armory, where public events are held; a Chamber of Commerce Office; a Senior Citizen Center; a train station; a Salvation Army that families frequent and a number of private businesses. The Commission does not think that is the right location for these establishments.
