Josephine Ching, Planning and Zoning presented the following:

- H. Public Hearing for a Zone Change from M-1:Light Industrial to C-2:General Commercial for Lot 3, ex. the west 10' and Lot 4, ex. the west 10', block 3 of the Wright Subdivision (5208 2nd Ave. W)

Dark Acres is located along Hwy 2/85 between Fairground Road and 51st Street W. Property is accessed Frontage Road and is currently serviced by septic system and rural water.

This zone change is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan goal of having a commercial corridor along Highway 2/85. The lot meets the district size requirements for C-2 based on Ordinance 1016, which eliminated the district size requirement for C-2 in the intended area along the Highway 2/85 corridor. There are currently three buildings on the property. The north building is being utilized as retail which is allowed under C-2. The east and south buildings are currently used for storage for the retail business and would need updates to be utilized for retail purposes.

The north building will need to meet the parking space requirement for general retail. The parking space requirement for general retail is 1 parking space per 250 square feet. Based on the square footage of 1,102 for the north building, the applicant will need to provide 4 parking spaces. All required parking space will need to be striped and paved. There is currently a paved area in front of the north building which should have sufficient paved area to meet the 4 parking space requirement.

At the ad hoc meeting, it was discussed that if the applicant wants to utilize the east and south building as retail in the future, the buildings will need to come into compliance to building standards in addition to meeting the parking space requirement for retail use.

Staff presented the zone change at the December 19th, 2016 Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. There was no discussion at the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting.

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends the approval of zone change for Lot 3 except W 10', Lot 4 except W 10', Block 3 of Wright Subdivision from M-1 to C-2, contingent on addressing all conditions required for approval, as listed in the memo included in the City Commission Packet.

Mayor Klug opened the hearing up for public comment on the proposed zone change. Mayor Klug repeated his request for public comment two additional times. There were no comments, and Mayor Klug declared the hearing closed.

Rachel Laqua, Planning and Zoning presented the following:

- I. Public Hearing for a Zone Change from M-1:Light Industrial to C-2:General Commercial for two lots in SW, Section 13, MS14-0129 and MS14-0130, T155N R101W (Target/Bear Paw Crew Camp)

This is a zone change for 1300 4th St E, which is Lodging Solutions or Target Logistics. The legal description is MS14-0129 in SW1/4 Sec 13, T155N R101W and MS14-0130 in SW1/4 Sec 13, T155N R101W. The application requests to re-zone from M-1: Light Industrial to C-2: General Commercial in order to repurpose the existing crew camp to a hotel. This would be an allowable use in the C-2 zone, though some modifications to the property, as it stands, would be needed.

The property itself is part of an area that the County had added as a future employment zone and most of that property is either light industrial or commercial. Since the property is along the corridor, commercial zoning would be appropriate.

The access to the property is currently CR 6. It would be the only access onto this road for both properties; the transportation plan does not support further entrances onto either CR 6 or Hwy 2/85. All presented plans should reflect these access concerns. The NDDOT and County Highway Department were asked to review these plans and had no further comment other than the one access should be utilized. The Transportation plan shows a backage road scenario which involves right of way to the east of this property or through this property. The Target plan that was provided to Planning and Zoning does reflect this. The plan is included in the City Commission Packet. Target did note that they would reconfigure their parking area if necessary, and the current plan reflects how parking could be arranged to accommodate that.

The buildings on the property are IBC standard modular units, which are attached via hurricane straps. The water and septic systems will be inspected along with all requirements for the fire marshal, including sprinkler plans, ingress and egress, and floor plans. The applicant will need to submit a full set of drawings to the Building Department; any zone change would be contingent on these drawings and the buildings on site being approved. This means that the remodel will essentially be evaluated as a new-build project, similar to how other crew camp repurposing has been done and will be evaluated as such by the City Building, Fire and Planning & Zoning Departments.

Water may be able to be switched to a rural water line that is capped near Fendee Estates; the applicant will look into this possibility as their water currently comes from rural water but is held in a tank and distributed via pumps.

Land Development Standards will need to be updated as required by Ordinance 1007 and the Zoning Ordinance as a contingency of the zone change. This will require a paved access and paved required parking, which are estimated to be about 600+ spaces. In addition, all areas not used for parking or access must be landscaped according to standards set forth in Ordinance 1007. The parking

shown on the site plan removes buildings to make way for parking. The updated site plan also removes the existing cabins in the SE quarter of the lot, which will need to be removed in order to be in compliance with the C-2 zone. The owner has agreed to this.

The lodge is currently empty, and, similar to other re-purposed crew camps, will only be able to be occupied as Certificate of Occupancies are granted for buildings, including provision of parking and access.

At the Planning & Zoning Commission Meeting, a Commissioner had noted the fact sheet, as written in the conditions, were based on the repurposing of the structure. The other option the owner could consider would be to remove all structures and utilize the property for some other commercial use as long as the use met zoning and building codes. The attorney noted that additional wording could be added to the conditions to reflect this option. Another Commissioner asked Target, if they had given any thought to the aesthetics of the building and specifically about the roof. Target had stated that they had not gotten quite that far in the process yet because their biggest efforts have been understanding what would need to be done to meet ADA standards, parking, and building standards and this zone change and once they get that approval they can look into the aesthetics of the re-model.

Conditions Required for Approval at the Planning and Zoning Commission are:

1. Removal of cabins
2. Repurposed buildings will only be able to be occupied as Certificate of Occupancies are granted for buildings, including provision of parking and access and meeting development standards as addressed.
3. Recordation of an access easement between the two properties

An additional condition to be required for approval based on comment at the Planning and Zoning Commission:

1. The zone change is granted based on the property coming into compliance, whether this is as repurposing the structures or removing the structures and creating some other C-2 compliant use. Storage of existing structures is not an allowable commercial use.

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommends the approval of zone change of MS14-0129 and MS14-0130 in SW1/4 Section 13, T155N R101W contingent on meeting all conditions required for approval, including addressing alternative future development as noted above.

Mayor Klug opened the hearing up for public comment on the proposed zone change. Mayor Klug repeated his request for public comment two additional times. There were no comments, and Mayor Klug declared the hearing closed.

Commissioner Cymbaluk reiterated that the request fits into the Future Land Use and Future Growth Maps to have the property identified as commercial and the owners are willing to meet the standards and criteria.

1) WAWSA Amendment to Agreement – Loan for Cost Share

At the November City Commission meeting, a loan agreement between WAWSA and its members that provided conditions for the borrowing of additional funds was presented and approved by the City. The details of this agreement are for all WAWSA members to adhere to, however, as a general WAWSA member, not a loaning member, the City was agreeing to terms to pay back loans that WAWSA would be borrowing through two of its members, Williams and R&T. As a result of further review by the WAWSA Board and its members, an amendment was issued to specify the delivery of loan funds from borrowing members and allow WAWSA to pursue additional interim financing. As a general member (non-loaning member), the amendment does not significantly change the terms of the original agreement, but still requires review and approval by the City Commission.

City Administrator recommends approval of the WAWSA Cost Share Agreement Amendment contingent on review and approval by the City Attorney.

Commissioner Cymbaluk requested clarification that the term of the Amendment does not change the City's obligations. Mr. Tuan stated that the City is still obligated to pay back the loans as a member of WAWSA regardless of who is borrowing. Mr. Tuan further stated that the cost share percentage for each member remains unchanged. The Amendment is changing details for the two members that are being asked to secure funds for their specific projects.

2) Memorandum of Understanding – Williams County

Attached is a proposed MOU between the City and County that details conditions for the construction of sidewalk bulb outs on Broadway and 2nd Ave E as part of the County Administration Building Project. The City had some concerns about this plan, safety related. There is a 4 lane section on Broadway that is difficult to cross. Having an extended pedestrian walkway out into the street, although it gives the perception of safety, the City is concerned that citizens crossing that section would not have the level of safety they think they do. The City and County have met multiple times to discuss improved intersection design and have proposed required terms in order for the County to install bulb outs that extend the existing sidewalk base next year. The City has asked the County to assume some liability should there be any accidents or issues that occur as a result of having one sidewalk bulb out in the middle of Broadway, as opposed to the multiple bulb outs on Main St. Similarly, the City remains committed to completing improvements on Broadway and changing that 4 lane section to a 3 lane section. The MOU shall expire in 2 years, or at such time when those street improvements on Broadway occur. This MOU has been reviewed and approved by the County Commission at their most recent December meeting.

City Administrator recommends approval of the City-County Sidewalk Construction MOU contingent on attorney review and approval.

Commissioner Brostuen requested clarification that the section of Broadway in question will stay a 4 lane until the City makes modifications at a later date. Mr. Tuan confirmed and further stated that the City can rebuild Broadway curb to curb and add bulb outs in a future construction plan, however, it is not something that the City budgeted for in 2017. The City had originally discussed a striping project to re-stripe Broadway into a 3 lane road between 2nd Ave W to 7th Ave E. However, until those improvements on Broadway are completed, the liability of the bulb out the County is requesting will fall on the County. Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if this request was part of the County's construction plan of the County Administration Building. Mr. Tuan confirmed and further stated that the building and bulb out construction would be completed at the same time in order to facilitate crossing from the new Administration building to the Courthouse. Commissioner Brostuen asked about the County's parking plan in front of the Courthouse building. Mr. Tuan stated that he was unsure of the official plan. However, the City's understanding, through other conversations, was that the County was looking at handicap spaces in front. Mr. Tuan reiterated that the MOU would expire in two years, regardless if the improvements to Broadway are completed.

3) 2016 Program Management Final Report

Included in the City Commission Packet, is a summary and table detailing the initiatives identified at the beginning of 2016. While the report provides details of all initiatives, AES2 would like to point out some significant areas to note. First, throughout 2016 the City and NDDOT collectively awarded construction contracts in excess of \$63,500,000.00, a total of 29 projects. Of those 29 projects, 22 are local City-led projects and 7 NDDOT-led projects. Second, in the past year, the City went through the process of levying special assessments totaling \$16,000,000.00 on 13 assessment district projects totaling \$42,000,000.00. Third, AE2S worked with staff to secure \$2,800,000.00 in reimbursements from the State Water Commission (SWC) for various water main improvement projects completed in 2014, 2015, and 2016. Also, the City, through efforts by City Engineer Hanson with support from AES2, secured \$3,600,000.00 in SWC grant funding for the West Williston Flood Control projects.

AES2 continued throughout the year to provide support to the Engineering department and the 2015 Comprehensive Plan, including updating master sewer and water plans, as well as, helping securing an architect and CMAR for the new Public Works Facility.

AES2 has also assisted in the development of the Strategic Communication Plan that can be used internally across departments, as well as, external communications, such as the media, social media, and residents. AES2 continues to work on the branding analysis, looking at different ways the City is projecting its image, as well as, streamline branding across City departments.

AES2 recommends accepting the 2016 Program Management Final Report as presented.

5) WRRF Contract Services Amendment

Included in the City Commission Packet is a proposed amendment for contract services on the WRRF project from AE2S. As the WRRF project has evolved, the original contract that was developed in 2011 has been amended to include various changes to design and services. Amendment #5 includes an increase in the allotment for Resident Project Representative (RPR) services for the construction phase of the project. The initial estimate for RPR services was developed prior to the bidding of the construction contracts and was a general estimate of time needed to observe and coordinate the construction phase. The City has nearly exceeded the original contract RPR Services amount and the Administrator is requesting an extension to the original contract in an amount not to exceed \$715,000.00.

This amendment would bring the design and construction phase services contract to a total of \$5,500,000.00, which is roughly 5.4% of the total project construction cost of \$103,000,000.00. Through the cost of this project the City has accomplished the following: 24-hour project coverage by the City Engineer, secured 3 prime contractors and dozens of sub-consultants, maintained a very good safety record, and has stayed under budget and on schedule, which the Department of Health has worked with the City to establish. It has been important to meet deadlines as it is a

requirement of the City's funding through the State Revolving Loan Program.

The City is hopeful that the project will come in under budget and ahead of schedule in 2017. To date, only one change order has been required, with another planned to accommodate changes to the Building footprint. The City is still expecting to be under the 1% of project change orders.

The City has been well served by the AE2S construction observation team on this large project and the City Administrator recommends approval of WRRF Contract Services Amendment #5 in the amount of \$715,000.00.

Safflower Technologies has applied for a Community Build STAR Fund grant of \$20,000.00 to assist with a feasibility study for specialty non-GMO of safflower oil processing facility for a range of oilseed processing and refining capabilities. They are also applying for an APUC grant \$27,775.00 for the remaining balance of the study. The company is looking at potential sites in the area for the processing plant. The study would also identify potential oilseed processing site locations with needed infrastructure and trans-loading facilities. This would bring value added agriculture to the area.

STAR Fund Board recommends approval of a STAR Fund Community Build Grant in the amount of \$20,000.00 for a feasibility study for a safflower oil processing plant in the area contingent upon the receipt of the \$27,775.00 APUC Grant.

Commissioner Cymbaluk asked if Safflower Technologies would be repay the grant, should the study prove to be beneficial and indicates feasibility for a processing plant in the area. Mr. Tuan confirmed that the terms were structured as a grant and not a loan; therefore it would not be repaid. Commissioner Cymbaluk further asked if the STAR Fund has funded such studies. Mayor Klug stated that the STAR Fund has done so in the past with companies.

Commissioner Cymbaluk also asked if "area" meant the City's immediate trade area. Mayor Klug confirmed that access to the rail was important to Safflower Technologies which would include the immediate trade area.

Motion by Brostuen, Seconded by Cymbaluk to approve a STAR Fund Community Build Grant in the amount of \$20,000.00 for a feasibility study for a safflower oil processing plant in the area to Safflower Technologies contingent upon receipt of the \$27,775.00 APUC Grant.
